Entry was free, but people had to get tickets to know which entrance to use and where to sit on the steps inside. And, of course, people could only enter the area meant for their social class. You can still see 29 numbers that mark places on some entrance arches. Did you know that there are 80 arches on each floor? 76 of them were for ordinary people and the remaining four were for the emperor and other VIPs.
