






Ryc. 25. Tell Chuera, przykłady naczyń typu Metallic Ware (wg Pruß A. 2000b, 203, fig. 2).







Fig. 60. Antentempel in der westlichen Ğazīra. 1: T. Huēra, Nordtempel; 2: T. Huēra, Außenbau; 3: T. Huēra, Steinbau 1 mit vorgelagerter Terrasse; 4: T. Huēra, Steinbau 6, jüngste Phase; 5: T. Bi'a, Tempel C.







Fig. 45. L'architecture EJIIIb de l'acropole de T. Beidar (reconstitution axonométrique)














Fig. 1. Tell Mozan/Urkesh: Site Plan








Fig. 8.11 Banat, tomb 7.

TELL BANAT – TOMB 7 (top) THE WHITE MONUMENT (bottom) ca. 2600-2450 BC












Fig. 9.5 Ebla; note thick enclosure wall around site and acropolis






Fig. 71. Ebla, Royal Palace G, Court of Audience, the royal dais under the northern porch, from the east, Early Bronze IVA





Fig. 72. Ebla, Royal Palace G, plan of the Administrative Quarter with the indication of the cuneiform archives rooms, Early Bronze IVA




Fig. 8.6 Limestone inlays from the "Standard of Ebla."


