For me is writing the best way how to share some important information with world so usually I'm writing articles for one not really famous(haha) women magazine about an environment issues. Sometimes I'm also trying to spread some thoughts through Instagram stories or posts but those are more private stuff.

I used to like to write short poems like a free style when I was upset and depressed but not anymore. Now I mostly write notes for school, those articles (one special thing I like besides just writing is looking for the information. It is always enriching) or just basic chatting message with my friends.

I would say it is something between 3 to 5 hours per week, which I spend writing voluntarily.

It could sounds cocky but yes I feel proud about the results of my writing. I'm always trying to do my best and it takes me hours to edit it to final version.

It feels kind a naturall for me to write. Doesn't mater if it is some school project, homework or anything else. I enjoy it and my mind feels free with transforming all those thoughts into the words.

I have no difficulties with sharing my work with other people. I suppose that it is the best way how to get some constructive criticism and improve my style for the future.

Not really. Creative writing is much more personal and subjective in comparing with academic writing where you have to stick with some rules and follow certain style and structure.

I like to read interesting articles on the internet, some magazines like Notabene what is the special kind of magazine in Slovakia because you can get it only from homeless people who are selling it on the street and 25% of the price is going directly to the seller. The articles in this magazine are good and profesional. Sometimes I also start to read a book but in many cases I do not finish it.

Normally I read about one to two hours per day in my leisure time.

Hmmm mostly I use of course writing skills, but also reading because when I write something longer I need to go through it over and over again to make it better. Speaking and listening I use occasionally when I need to read some part for myself and actually hear how it sounds out loud.

The essay is the text with an introduction, main part and confusion. You can decide what essay you want to write, for example opinion essay, compare and contrast essay or for and against essay. For each you need to follow another instructions and rules.

Favorite ones:

ARTWORK – there is never the right or the wrong way how to make or understand art. Its just about the joy

HOW TO GUIDE – bc it's really helpful thing, you actually really achieve something from it and also kinda hard to be able to provide some information in such a easy and accessible way for public

DOCUMENTARY – I like that you need to mix up visual, story and the contenct with coments and it always looks so beautiful, impress audience and give them much bigger overview about the theme not only in visual way but also some academic knowledge

BLOG – writing about anything you want is the real freedom for writer and if also people want to read it and the blog somehow inspires them its the win win situation

RECIPE – making something delicious based just on ingredients and the right order is simply magical *Not really academic:*

FAMILY TREE – there no information u can gain from this except the name and that is not academic

INVITATION – its based on some kind of kindness with basics about an event

CV – getting some personal information about a person i would not consider academic

JOKE – simply no academic value, mostly based on primitive kind of fun

PAPER DOLLS – u cannot learn anything from it what would help you in solving any life problems
