

<u>Todorov's Narrative Theory</u> 1) A state of equilibrium - (all is as it should be) 2) A disruption of that order – (by an event) 5) A return or **restoration** of a new equilibrium 3) A recognition 4) An attempt to **repair** that the disorder the damage - (of has occurred the disruption) Todorov argues that narrative involves a transformation. The characters or the situations are transformed through the progress of the disruption.


Todorov: Equilibrium


