# Coreference

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- (2) After [NP the baroness]<sub>1</sub> had visited the lord, [NP she ]<sub>2</sub> left the house. (she ≠ baroness)
- (3) Definition: Antecedent  
A is the antecedent of B iff (if and only if) (i) A precedes B, and  
(ii) A and B corefer.

## Types of (non-)coreference

- (4) obligatory coreference
- a. Zelda<sub>1</sub> bores herself<sub>1</sub>.
  - b. \*Zelda<sub>1</sub> bores herself<sub>2</sub>.

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  - a. She<sub>8</sub> adores Zelda<sub>15</sub>'s teachers.
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- (6) optional coreference
  - a. Zelda<sub>15</sub> adores her<sub>15</sub> teachers.
  - b. Zelda<sub>14</sub> adores her<sub>5</sub> teachers.

## Types of referential expressions

- (7)
- a. reflexives and reciprocals ('anaphors'):  
himself, herself, itself, themselves, myself, yourself,  
ourselves, yourselves each other, one another
  - b. non-reflexive pronouns ('pronominals'): he, she, it, him,  
her, I, us, you, me, his, your, my, our
  - c. full NPs including names ('r-expressions'): the baroness,  
Peter, this, a disinherited Russian countess . . .

## Reflexives must have a clause-bound antecedent

- (8)
- a. That it rains bothers Peter.
  - b. That it rains bothers her/him.
  - c. \*That it rains bothers himself/herself.

## Pronouns and nouns cannot have a clause-bound antecedent

- (9)
- a. \*Peter<sub>4</sub> watches Peter<sub>4</sub> in the mirror.
  - b. \*Peter<sub>4</sub> watches him<sub>4</sub> in the mirror.
  - c. Peter<sub>4</sub> watches himself<sub>4</sub> in the mirror.

## Pronouns can have a non-local antecedent

- (10)
- a. \*Carla<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate Carla<sub>4</sub>
  - b. Carla<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate her<sub>4</sub>.
  - c. \*Carla<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate herself<sub>4</sub>.

# Binding Conditions

- (11) Binding Conditions (preliminary)
- a. A reflexive pronoun must have an antecedent within its local clause.

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- (12)
- a. \*That it rains bothers himself/herself.  
(no antecedent)
  - b. \*Carla<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate herself<sub>4</sub>.  
(non-local antecedent)
  - c. Peter<sub>2</sub> watches himself<sub>2</sub> in the mirror.  
(local antecedent)

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  - b. Carla<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate her<sub>4</sub>.  
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  - c. \*Peter<sub>3</sub> watches him<sub>3</sub> in the mirror.  
(local antecedent)

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(no antecedent)
  - b. \*Carla<sub>4</sub>/she<sub>4</sub> thinks that I hate Carla<sub>4</sub>.  
(non-local antecedent)
  - c. \*Peter<sub>3</sub>/he<sub>3</sub> watches Peter<sub>3</sub> in the mirror.  
(local antecedent)

## C-command

- (13) Carlotta<sub>4</sub>'s dog accompanies her<sub>4</sub>//\*herself<sub>4</sub> to kindergarten.


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
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- (13) Carlotta<sub>4</sub>'s dog accompanies her<sub>4</sub>//\*herself<sub>4</sub> to kindergarten.
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  - An r-expression must not have a **c-commanding** antecedent

# The structure




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
- (15) Node A c-commands node B in a phrase marker iff
- neither dominates the other, and
  - every (branching) node that dominates A also dominates B

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
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


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- (17) Binding Conditions
- A reflexive pronoun must have a c-commanding antecedent within its local clause.

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


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
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- (18) Node A c-commands node B in a phrase marker iff
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- (19) Node A c-commands node B in a phrase marker iff you can go from A to B by going one node up, and then only down, while never crossing a branch twice
- (20) Binding Conditions
- A non-reflexive pronoun must not have a c-commanding antecedent within its local clause.

Petr likes himself's sister  
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
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

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## Missing subjects

(24) Sentences with unexpressed subjects

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- a. Look there!
- b. The best way *to succeed* is to do what's right
- c. Sp -í -m.  
sleep pres 1.sg  
'I am sleeping.'



  - f. (pro) Vid-í-m svou sestru.  
1.sg see-pres-1sg self's sister  
'I see my sister.'





  - b. John seems to work hard.


## 'logical' structure



## Raising structure




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
