Presenting your individual research papers (topic, research questions, primary and secondary sources)

Targeted Learning Outcome

Identifying issues with current state of research and finding possible solutions

Present briefly your paper

- What is your topic?
- What are your primary and secondary sources?
- What is currently known in your area of research and do you have any idea how you might contribute to the field (your position)?
- What is/are your research question(s)?
- What kind of challenges are you facing with your research?
- Do you have any possible solutions to the issues you are facing right now?

Take-aways

- Your research is still in an early stage you got time to come up with your position on the specific area of your interest.
- Rest assured that it is natural to do a wider research first and then narrowing it down to certain areas and / or cases of your interest.
- However, we are moving towards the execution phase of the seminar. You should at least know what topic you would like to research and what parts of your selected area offer a hypothesis for a short research paper.
