

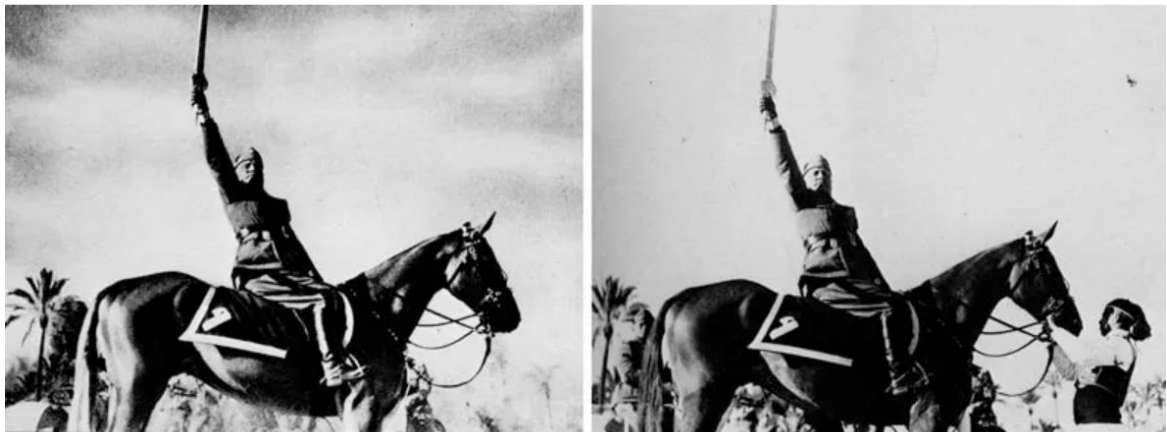
1. Stalin Airbrushes Out His Enemies, circa 1930

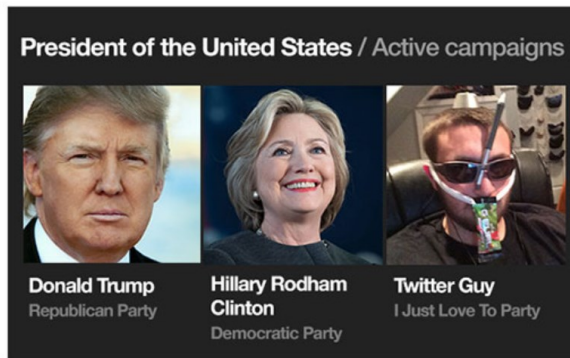

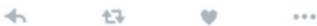

4. Kim Jong Un Fake Korean Missile launch
