


The Little Prince

 - ... Individualism or collectivism?




The Animal Farm

- Propaganda, leadership, absolute control
- Napoleon and Snowball as two **political forces**, rivals
- Squaler represents propaganda, "fake news"
- Corrupting influence of **power**
- Importance of **freedom** and **equality**
- Preserving justice and empathy
- What are the conclusions drawn from the story?
- What are the pros and cons of individualism?
- What are the pros and cons of collectivism?




Discussion

- individualism and collectivism may coexist on different levels, on a vertical and a horizontal axis
- human behavior and our values are influenced by the cultural, historical and societal context we live in
- each culture, nation and ethnicity may have their own way to view the world, they support and cherish different behavior, values, goals, etc.
- level of individualism and collectivism may be set by a general agenda in the society, which may be **implicit** and **naturally developed**, or it can be **intentionally taught** and **executed** (an ideology) for a certain purpose, usually set by those who hold power/influence/resources in the society



Mind map


- power of **connection**
- to strive for **our own sake**, own goals and status
- to strive for **the sake of us all**, for the sake of the society we later live in or which we leave for those who come after us
- altruism
- reciprocity
- individualist and collectivist actions can both be beneficial, useful and of good intentions and purpose
- both can also be misused and misinterpreted
- it depends on how we used the idea, how the ideology is created, supported, and executed



Conceptualization


- The **individualist** orientation emphasizes the importance of **individual self-identity**, **personal agency**, and values that tend to prioritize **individuals over collectives**
- The **collectivist perspective** emphasizes the importance of one's **collective identity**, **collective agency**, and values that tend to prioritize **collectives over individuals**
- These concepts may **coexist**.
- It may change over time.
- Multidimensional or bidimensional construct


Society

- What are they?




Mental health

- How can **collectivism** propagate our mental health?




Relationships

- How to love others while keeping on loving ourselves?






