








About Urban Fringes

An urban fringe is a zone of transition and interface between urban and country areas, where a broad variety of land uses and activities come together










Objectives SURF









Project challenges

Challenges facing urban fringes, include:

- complex issues of ownership and administration
- declining biodiversity
- deteriorating water quality
- low green space value
- poor access
- threat from growth and expansion
- inconsistent spatial planning policy
- Impact from changing demographics.
